WHY WE EXIST

McKenzie was here. She was held, known, and deeply loved.

Before we tell you what we do, we want to share how this journey began.

When McKenzie was born, our world changed forever. She entered a family that loved her deeply, and although our time with her was only six days, those days were filled with extraordinary love. Her death was unexpected. The palliative care nurses and hospital staff around us encouraged us to simply be her parents: to hold her, dress and bathe her, read to her, and create memories together. They helped us preserve her handprints and footprints, record her heartbeat, take photographs, and gather other mementos we will treasure for the rest of our lives.

Only later did we learn that many of those keepsakes had been paid for by hospital staff or donated by other bereaved parents. Their generosity showed us both what compassionate care can mean and how fragile access to it can be. While we were in the hospital, we grieved that McKenzie would never see the sun. The name McKenzie's Rays of Sunshine grew from that heartbreak - and from our promise that her light would reach other families. We created this organization so parents facing the loss of a baby can be free to love and parent their child, preserve irreplaceable memories, and know they are not alone.

WHAT FAMILIES CAN COUNT ON Compassionate support at the bedside, tangible ways to preserve their child's memory, and care that continues through the first year of grief.

Vision

We envision a future in which every family facing the loss of a baby is surrounded by compassionate care, from the first overwhelming hours in the hospital through the first year of grief. Every parent will have support to make precious memories, meaningful ways to carry their child's presence home, and a community that continues to remember their child by name.

Mission

McKenzie's Rays of Sunshine exists to ensure that families experiencing pregnancy and infant loss receive compassionate, practical support at the hospital and throughout the first year of grief. Beginning in Southeast Louisiana, we provide memory-making kits and funeral assistance while building a continuum of follow-up care that helps parents honor their child, preserve irreplaceable memories, and feel less alone.

WHY THIS WORK MUST EXIST**The need is not theoretical. It is here.**

Families across Louisiana encounter pregnancy loss, stillbirth, neonatal death, and infant death every year. The crisis is medical. What follows is also emotional, practical, financial, and lifelong.

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The CDC reports that about 21,000 babies are stillborn in the United States each year - roughly the same number who die before their first birthday.¹

Louisiana's 2024 Child Death Review reported an average of 429 infant deaths per year from 2020 through 2022. During that period, Louisiana's infant mortality rate was 7.5 per 1,000 live births, compared with 5.5 nationally.²

Professional guidance recognizes that compassionate care includes more than clinical treatment. The American College of Obstetricians and Gynecologists identifies family photography, keepsakes, and hand- or footprint molds as constructive memory-making options when consistent with a family's wishes.³

ACOG also calls for follow-up after miscarriage, stillbirth, or neonatal death that includes emotional support, bereavement counseling, and appropriate referrals to counselors and support groups.⁴

WHAT WE CLAIM A memory kit does not erase grief. It does something more honest: it gives parents choices, connection, and irreplaceable pieces of their child's story while there is still time to preserve them.

WHAT WE DO

We put something loving and practical into a family's hands.

At the heart of the program is a carefully assembled memory kit designed for the hospital bedside. We build and refine each kit with nurses - the people beside families during the first hours of loss - so it meets real bedside needs.



A prepared memory kit brings several forms of memory-making support together in one place.

What families receive	Why it matters
Weighted bear with heartbeat recorder	Matched to the baby's birth weight, with a recorder inside to preserve the baby's heartbeat.
NICU clothing for micro-preemies and preemies	Specially sized clothing lets parents dress their baby when standard newborn sizes are far too large.
Hand- and footprint casting and ink supplies	Casting and ink materials preserve tiny hands and feet in molds and prints for loved ones.
Personalized keepsake plaque	Space for a photograph, handprint, and footprint in one lasting piece.
Memory and guidance materials	A place for a lock of hair, a card, and gentle printed guidance for the hours ahead.
Funeral assistance	Direct financial help, separate from the kit, when resources allow.

CURRENT UNIT COST Approximately \$130 covers the present material cost of one complete kit, including modest room for the printed parent guide now in development. Costs are reviewed as supplies and customization change.

EARLY PROOF

A local response, already at work.

What began with one family's vision is now reaching hospital care teams and earning growing community support.

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In its first months, McKenzie's Rays of Sunshine has assembled and delivered kits to two area hospitals, worked directly with hospital staff, provided funeral assistance, and earned meaningful donor confidence. These early partnerships establish a strong foundation for reliable hospital readiness, responsive practical assistance, and care that continues after families leave the hospital.

\$1,300	Supports approximately ten families through an unimaginable goodbye with keepsakes made to last.
\$5,000	Helps approximately 38 families leave the hospital with tangible reminders that their child was here and deeply loved.
\$10,000	Helps approximately 75 families be met with tenderness, dignity, and something meaningful to hold onto.

Giving levels are based on an estimated \$130 material cost per kit and are intentionally approximate. Funeral assistance and first-year follow-up care are funded separately.
